- Mixes up Joseph with 'Gerry' (husband)

- Complaints to Manager
- Susan and Brandon Financial POA
- Susan Substitute Decision-maker Health
- Missing art objects \$\$\$
- Martha revokes POA
- > Trip
- > Marriage
- Don't shift apartments 2 AL apartments
- 3 months later, Martha says she wants to separate from 'Gerry' who isn't at all like he used to be

Court Decisions on Capacity to Marry:

Durham v. Durham (1885), 10 P.D.80

- Is the person capable of understanding the nature of the contract and the obligations and responsibilities it involves?
- Browning v. Reane (1812), 161 E.R. 1080
 - Is the party capable of understanding the marriage contract itself and...
 - Is the party capable of taking care of his own person or property?
- Banton v. Banton et al. (1998), 164 D/L/R/ (4th) 176 (Ont. Ct. Gen. Div.)
 - Applies Durham
 - But also accepts the second branch of the Browning test.

Care Agreements

Care Agreements involve a transfer of property (usually the family home) in exchange for a promise of care and support, often even a promise to "care for life".







Care Agreements



The "What Ifs..."

- ? What if the caregiver or care recipient marries or enters a marriage-like relationship after a care agreement is made?
- ? What if the caregiver or care recipient, married at the time of transfer of property, is later divorced or widowed?
- ? What if the caregiver needs to relocate? Does the care recipient expect that the promise of care will include remaining in that particular house?
